### Week 2: Recovering the Original Plan



#### Monday

BACK TO THE BEGINNING



According to popular culture, men are from Mars and women are from Venus. But according to Sacred Scripture, God created **both** men and women i**n the Divine Image**. That means that both men and women reflect the image of God. After creating each part of His world, God said about it, "It is good." Yet only after the creation of man and woman did He say, "It is VERY good."

## Tuesday

THE CROWN OF CREATION

So the LORD God cast a deep on the man, and while he was asleep, he took out one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh.
Genesis 2:21

How have you appreciated the different roles you play within your family. Ask Jesus and Mary to reveal to you how you can more effectively live out your appreciation for your spouse.

### Wednesday


Genesis 3: 11B-13

Man and woman, more directly, you and your spouse were created to work together, in tandem, as a team. But Original Sin has made that about as difficult as possible. Thanks to the sins of our fathers and mothers, we have been handed down concupiscence, fallen human nature. To think that your own concupiscence only affects you is naive. In marriage we become one, and we ought to start looking at our own difficulties through that lens: just as Adam and Eve shared jointly the effects of Original Sin, so our own fallen human nature affects our unity with our spouse.

Take some time today to ask yourself some hard questions:

- → How or where in our marriage do we need to be more unified?
- → How do I blame my spouse or children for things instead of standing up and helping them or protecting them?
- → Where do I need to own my fault in a difficulty in our marriage/family?

Thursday




Echoing what you may have heard if you received ashes on Ash Wednesday, take some time today and remember your death. As they say in Latin, *Memento Mori*. Ask yourself these three key questions:

- → What things are stressing you out that wouldn't really matter if you were to die today?
- → If you died today, would your spouse and children remember you as you would want them to remember you?
- → If not, where do you need God's help to change?

Friday

GRATITUDE REVISITED



Even after Adam and Eve were disobedient and hid from God, abdicated their personal responsibility and really acted quite wretchedly, God still found them where they were at, supplied their needs and set them up for success as a couple and eventually a family.

We started with a gratitude reflection this week. Let's also end there.

- → What are the ways that God has continued to supply your family with grace upon grace even amidst your faults and failings?
- → Where is God loving you?
- → How can you make gratitude a regular part of your life, especially in your relationship with God?

After these reflections this week, consider your commitments that you have made. How are you doing? Do you think you should change any of them or add to them?
